## What is Weathering?

Weathering is a natural process that breaks apart or changes rock. Some of the natural forces that cause weathering include heat, water, wind, and living things. There are three main types of weathering: physical, biological, and chemical. Weathering, unlike erosion, breaks things up into smaller pieces but does not move them away.

## What is Erosion?

Erosion is what moves the soil and tiny rocks that weathering leaves behind. The wind and water carry the sediment (small pieces of rock or sand) to a new location. Erosion can happen because gravity pulls soil downhill, it can also happen because of strong weather, like rain or wind. Erosion is a very slow process. It happens over many, many years.
